


## Upcoming Events Sponsored by Friends of the Idyllwild Library

### Children's Programs

Although we have experienced a sizzlinhot summer, this hasn't slowed down the summer programs. Get an iced cold drink and find a shady spot so you can learn about all the cool things that have been happening at the library this summer. The theme for this summer's reading program is *Read, Renew, Repeat.* To kick off the summer program, children were entertained by talented musician *Craig Newton,* who inspired the children with an interactive music program. He performed on various musical instruments, e.g. guitar, violin, flute, trombone, electric guitar, banjo and more.



Other special summer children's programs included the following:

Miss Rachel and the band Space Goats for a rockin' musical outer space story time. Children were so pleased to welcome Miss Rachel for another lively story time about our solar system.



Riverside County Department of Waste Resources presented an interactive story time that included a fun recycling game explaining to the children the importance of recycling.

Bob Greenamyer, Idyllwild Community Garden, taught the children about community gardens and read a delightful book about sunflowers. Children decorated flowerpots and planted sunflower seeds to take home. There were two recycling craft programs. We made woven bowls from paper bowls and yarn. The other program was how to make a CD Garden Mobile. The children have beautiful pieces of artwork that serve as reminders of different ways to recycle.

On July 17, 2024, 5:30 p.m., *Riverside County Department of Waste Resources* will present a program about how to do **composting** at home.

Summer reading will close out with a party and an amusing program by **ventriloquist Joe Gandelman and Friends.** 



Top readers will be awarded prizes. All children will select a book from the book cart to take home.

The top three readers in age categories — 0-5 years, 6-12 years, and teens — will each be awarded great prizes. The top adult reader receives a \$50 Barnes and Noble gift card. Each week a random drawing takes place and the weekly winner receives a backpack full of fun prizes and a \$10 gift card from one of the following businesses: Alpaca Coffee & Tea, Amelia's Donuts, Candy Cupboard, El Buen Cacao, Far East Imports, Pure Bean Coffee. The 5-Book Challenge recipients received a \$5 gift card to Atomic Cow Creamery and a free book.



Everyone who registered for summer reading received a free book, as well.

Upon completion of reading levels, participants are given Level 1, 2, and 3 awards (wooden bookmark, beverage cup, and bookbag).

On July 31, 2024, 11:00 a.m., we are pleased to have *Leya Collins* with the *Western Science Center* give a program about *Ice Age Animals* who lived in our area.


