Children's Programs

Spring 2025 – Children's Programs Fresh air, warmer weather and blooming flowers. What's not to love about spring? Besides delighting in another beautiful springtime in Idyllwild, we've been enjoying a lot of great children's programs at the library.

We were pleased to host **Janice Murasko** with **ARF** (Animal Rescue Friends) in February for a very important story time about dog safety. Janice's presentation was truly engaging and enjoyable. Her enthusiasm and insights on dog safety truly made an impact on the children and adults. We thank Janice for giving of her time to bring this timely message to the children of our community.





At the **Read Across America** story time on March 5, we introduced a new digital resource offered by Riverside County Library System known as **TeachingBooks**. TeachingBooks is a PreK–12 reading and library service that has hundreds of thousands of videos, audio, and online resources designed to deepen everyone's connections to the books they are reading. This new resource is made possible by the California State Library and the Riverside County Office of Education.

Dia de los Libros y Ninos/Day of the Books and Children is a yearly celebration of children, families, and reading. It always culminates at the end of April. Volunteer Pat McComas will be sharing bilingual stories observing National Frog (Rana) Month with the theme "Don't Worry, Be Hoppy!" Bilingual story times are normally held the first Wednesday of each month. Mother's Day bilingual story time is celebrated with a charming and yummy tea for moms. This spring, we once again partnered with *In-N-Out Burger* for the annual *Cover to Cover* children's reading program. Participants earn a free hamburger or cheeseburger by reading just five books or for every five hours they read. This program has always proved to be a great reading incentive. We appreciate In-N-Out Burgers' generosity for sponsoring this literacy program.

The caterpillars and butterflies make a return in May. Children observe caterpillars grow, become chrysalids, and emerge as butterflies. It's always a grand time every spring releasing the **painted lady butterflies**.



Idyllwild's Best Book Club/Youth Book Club is going strong. The 'tweens and teens are busy reading up a storm. We completed a fun narrative-fiction series by Jessie Janowitz with *The Doughnut Fix* and *The Doughnut King*. For March's book club we shared our thoughts on the classic fantasy *The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe* by C.S. Lewis. In April book club we'll consider Aaron Johnson's dual-time narrative entitled *Mystery in Rocky Mountain National Park*. We always have a good book discussion, followed by a theme-related craft, and end with a delicious snack. We appreciate the Friends of the Library for their support of this book club.

Some of the projects we enjoyed at the afterschool STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) program included playing a version of ice hockey and sliding various objects (rocks, marbles, pom poms, bottle caps) over a sheet of ice in order to determine the amount of friction made by the object and whether they would slide on the ice. Another STEAM program involved learning about Bernoulli's Principle. We discovered how air pressure changes allow objects to lift off the ground, i.e. airplanes. Children had fun levitating a ping pong ball and a balloon, flipping a soda can from one cup to another by applying air pressure without touching the soda can.



The experiment in April entails learning about the science and physics involved in making a bouncy ball.

The library once again collaborated with **@Neighborhood Forest**, which provides free trees for children to plant. The trees normally arrive at the library in time for the children to plant them before **Earth Day**.

Idyllwild Library along with **Mayor Max** played a role in the **Riverside County Arts** & Culture Month in March 2025. Participants could pick up a Riverside County Exploration Passport at our library in order to take an artistic adventure throughout the county to the various participating galleries, museums, and cultural centers.
